## TOWN OF LONG LAKE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

December 12, 2023 Town Hall

The regular monthly Town Board meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Chairman Bob Moullette. Supervisor I, Jeff Bauer, and Supervisor II, Terry O'Brien, were present, along with Clerk Debbie Bouma and Treasurer Brenda Derousseau. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The Clerk confirmed the verification of notices.

**Approval of Minutes:** Motion by O'Brien and seconded by Bauer to approve the minutes of November 14, 2023, Regular Board Meeting and November 27, 2023, Special Board Meeting. Motion carried.

**Approval of Financial Report:** Motion by Bauer and seconded by O'Brien to accept the Treasurer's Financial Report as presented. Motion carried. The Clerk presented a check for \$19,094.83 from the Birchwood Four Corner Emergency Building Fund; this money will be applied with the first payment for the loan taken out for the building in March. Also, the Clerk spoke of contacting CCF Bank to improve the interest rate for the general checking as the Wisconsin Local Government Investment Pool rate is at 5.5%.

**Discuss/Action Encroachment of Town Property by BMR Holdings LLC:** Jess DeGross expressed interest in moving forward with a public hearing to purchase the land from the town after saying his survey was complete. DeGross will forward a copy of the survey to the Clerk. Motion by O'Brien and seconded by Moullette to have the Clerk proceed in setting up a meeting of the electors to discuss the possible sale of the land once a copy of the survey is supplied to the Town. Motion carried.

**Public Comment:** Joe Hoy announced that he would be running for re-election as the town's county supervisor and would like the town's support. Rich Alvin asked about some properties doing building and if they had pulled the necessary permits, and he also commented that the walls are painted and patched in the town hall.

The Special Town Board meeting was called to order at 3:01 p.m. by Chairman Bob Moullette. Supervisor I, Jeff Bauer, and Supervisor II, Terry O'Brien, were present, along with Clerk Debbie Bouma. Treasurer Brenda Derousseau was absent. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The Clerk confirmed the verification of notices.

**Discussion Roads:** Discussion was had about placing items out for bid on the two planned projects. The Clerk is requested to email the board example bids that she has on file for them to review.

**Discussion Town Hall Ramp and Railing:** O'Brien offered to pay the \$1000 for the railing and returns to make the ramp compliant. Moullette spoke of an offer to remove the current ramp and have it replaced with donated cement work. Discussion was had on what added cost this would be to the town and is it even needed. Clerk was asked to check with Washburn County on the need for a new land use permit and variance since it was new construction, and our old land use has expired and report back to the board. O'Brien rescinded his offer at this point.

Discussion on Encroachment of Town Hall Property by BMR Holdings LLC: Jess Degross stated that a survey had not been completed, but he would have the property line staked out within the next week. Discussion was had by the Board to still move forward with calling a Meeting of the Electors. Clerk reported that the town assessor stated the asset value, not the sale price, is \$16,000 for that 1.1-acre Clerk was asked to find out who had to be notified by letter, and the public hearing posting to ask if the town electors are willing to sell the 1.1 acre.

**Discussion on Eastside Rd Power box:** Moullette spoke of the conversation he had with Barron Electric about the power box and that it would be reviewed at Barron Electric, but it would take time, probably up to a year, to see if it can be moved.

**Discussion Alley Abandonment:** The Clerk informed the Board that letters have been sent to adjacent property owners on December 21, 2023, of possible action taking place at the January 9th meeting.

**Discussion Building Inspector:** Discussions on both building inspector's paperwork and state reports were had. Clerk was requested to contact Independent Inspections and asked about their general liability policy. Item was tabled until next meeting.



## TOWN OF LONG LAKE RESOLUTION 2024-1 ORDER VACATING UNPAVED ALLEY

Re: Vacation of a portion of an unpaved alley located within N1532 County Highway MD, Sarona, Washburn County, Wisconsin

This matter came up for hearing on the Ninth day of January 2024 before the Town Board of the Town of Long Lake.

The Town having filed its Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town adopts the following resolution and order:

RESOLVED, the application for vacation of unpaved alley submitted to the Town of Long Lake by Scott Nichols and Lynn Nichols, petitioners, dated November 17, 2023, be and is hereby granted; and,

The following unpaved alley, pursuant to the provisions of Section 66.1003(3), Wis. Stats., be and is hereby vacated this Ninth day of January 2024:

The unpaved alley is located on a parcel of land known as N1532 County Highway MD, Sarona, Washburn County, Wisconsin and lying between part of Lot A and Lots 25, 26 and Lakeview Avenue. The parcels of land are described as follows:

A parcel of land located in Gov't Lot 2 of Section 16, T37N, R11W, Long Lake Township, Washburn County, Wisconsin that is Lots 25, 26, Lakeview Avenue and part of Lot "A" and of the Plat of Alvern with the part of Lot "A" described as follows: Commencing at the Northwest corner of Lot "A", which is the intersection of the East line of County Trunk M and the North line of Lot "A", thence Southeasterly along the East line of County Trunk M, 300 feet: thence Easterly to the Southwest corner of Lakeview Avenue aforesaid, which is the intersection of the South line of Lakeview Avenue with the East line of Lot "A"; thence Northwesterly along the East line of Lot "A" to the Northeast corner of Lot "A", thence Westerly on the North line of Lot "A", 375 feet to the place of the beginning.

The unpaved alley is 14.84 feet wide at the Southerly end and 16.56 feet wide at the Northerly end and borders the Easterly line of that part of Lot "A" and the Westerly line of Lots, 25, 26 and Lakeview Avenue.
